The Magic Flute in Catalan

Beyond a tale of magic, fantastical creatures and extraordinary adventures, *The Magic Flute* is a profound reflection on humanity's capacity for goodness.

Throughout their journey, the characters discover that true strength comes not from power or domination, but from generosity, compassion and trust in others.

Jaume Villanueva's staging highlights this essential idea: kindness as a force for transformation.

In a world often shaped by fear, conflict and division, Mozart and Schikaneder remind us that light prevails only when we listen, understand and help one another.

Inspired by Joaquim Pena's historic Catalan translation, this production brings together singers, musicians, puppetry, dance and visual theatre in a celebration of imagination and human values.

The music is performed by ten solo players from the Orquestra de Cambra Terrassa 48, a leading Catalan ensemble and a longstanding collaborator of Opera Popular de Barcelona.

More than 230 years after its premiere, *The Magic Flute* continues to move audiences with its timeless reminder that kindness is a form of courage.

World Premiere: 10 October 2025 at the Teatre Fortuny, opening concert of the 2025–26 Season of the Associació de Concerts de Reus.

Mozart, like all genuine art, does not need to be understood in order to reach the soul.

Sublime in the beauty of kindness — that ineffable substance from which dreams are made, present even in the humblest note — Mozart's humble greatness reveals itself by leading us into a state of complete abstraction, of forgetting: that ennoblement described by Schopenhauer, the transcendental foundation implicit in all beauty.

Transcendence is a virtue.

Virtue is the disposition that enables a being to act in the most noble way in life. And if any human being has possessed this gift throughout the long, arduous and tortuous course of history — a gift uniquely human — that being was Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart.

Mozart In praise of kindness

To explain Mozart is a risky undertaking.

Mozart is a feeling, like love, like the tenderness of that ideal friend we have all dreamed of and that many fortunate people are lucky enough to find. I could not understand humanity without him.

To describe the ineffable sense of fulfilment he awakens in me, I would have to seek refuge in the Sonata in C major (KV 330/1), where Mozart was a child like me: a beautiful and playful companion who stepped out of the score, took me by the hand and carried me away, dancing beside him.

Perhaps one of the purposes of music is to make us feel when words can no longer reach us.

Mozart's closeness to ordinary people, his understanding of their needs, and the contribution of his work to the spread of culture, Enlightenment values, social criticism and freedom, completely dismantle the false and superficial clichés that portray him as frivolous, insignificant or trivial.

Mozart's life and work contribute, almost magically, to the progress of humanity.

Magic is a constant presence in Mozart and in his life, just as it is an essential part of goodness and virtue.

In the confrontation between good and evil that gives life to *The Magic Flute*, we come to understand that evil does not exist in itself; that good is the natural state; and that evil is nothing more than the absolute absence of good.

Once this truth is understood, we invite you to share in a purpose undertaken with the humility that kindness demands. Into it we have poured all the dedication of which we are capable.

Behind every gesture, every note, every almost imperceptible movement, lie countless hours of perseverance, discipline, rigour, solitude, sacrifice and work.

There have also been days filled with great joy and kindness.

We are not mercenaries.

Music has made us brothers and sisters.

Nothing has been easy here.

Nothing has been given to us.

We are here because kindness has prevailed over the pettiness and ambitions of a few unfortunate human beings.

The magic of this *Magic Flute* is the result of an immense collective effort into which all of us have poured our hearts, because our lives are bound up in it.

And because we are proud to have devoted so much of our lives to reaching this moment, we wish to share it all, humbly, with you.

THE OPERA

The Magic Flute An Opera for Everyone

Premiered on 30 September 1791 at Vienna's Theater auf der Wieden, just a few weeks before Mozart's death, *The Magic Flute* is one of the most distinctive and universally loved operas in the repertoire.

With a libretto by Emanuel Schikaneder, it brings together elements of folk tale, German theatrical tradition, Enlightenment philosophy and Masonic symbolism in a story that moves constantly between fantasy and moral reflection.

Through the initiatory journey of Tamino and Pamina, the opera explores values such as wisdom, fraternity, courage and the search for truth. All this is accompanied by music capable of moving from moments of profound spiritual depth to episodes of humour, tenderness and immediate emotional appeal.

More than two centuries after its premiere, *The Magic Flute* remains one of the most frequently performed operas in the world and one of the finest gateways into Mozart's extraordinary musical universe.

SYNOPSIS

A Prince, a Princess and an Impossible Mission

The young Prince Tamino is pursued by a terrible serpent. Just as he is about to succumb, he is rescued by the Three Ladies of the Queen of the Night.

Upon awakening, he meets Papageno, a charming bird-catcher as imaginative as he is boastful, who does not hesitate to claim the credit for having saved him. His deception is immediately uncovered by the Three Ladies, who punish him before presenting Tamino with the portrait of Pamina, daughter of the Queen of the Night.

The moment he sees her image, Tamino falls deeply in love.

The Queen of the Night then appears to ask for his help: her daughter has been abducted by Sarastro, a powerful ruler who dwells in a mysterious realm.

Tamino accepts the mission to rescue her.

To aid him on his journey, he is given a magic flute capable of taming wild beasts and transforming hearts. Papageno will accompany him, carrying a set of enchanted bells for protection.

But as they travel onward, both discover that things are not exactly as they seemed.

Perhaps Sarastro is not the monster they have been led to believe.

Perhaps the truth is more complex than they imagined.



SYNOPSIS

The Path to Light

When Tamino arrives at Sarastro's temple, he discovers an unexpected reality. Far from being a cruel tyrant, Sarastro governs a world founded on wisdom, justice and knowledge.

Pamina also comes to understand that she has been deceived, and that the true struggle is not between Sarastro and the Queen of the Night, but between reason and the forces of fear, hatred and revenge.

To prove his maturity, Tamino must undergo a series of initiatory trials. Silence, perseverance and trust become his greatest allies.

Pamina, too, must overcome her doubts and suffering. Only together can they complete the path that leads to fulfilment.

Meanwhile, Papageno follows a very different path. More interested in life's simple joys than in philosophical questions, he dreams of finding someone with whom to share happiness.

In the end, love, kindness and fidelity triumph over darkness.

Tamino and Pamina overcome the trials and attain the light. Papageno finds his beloved Papagena. The Queen of the Night and her allies are defeated, and harmony is restored.

Thus concludes one of Mozart's most human works: a celebration of kindness, freedom and the human capacity for self-improvement.

SYMBOLISM

The Magic of The Magic Flute

More than two centuries after its premiere, *The Magic Flute* continues to fascinate audiences of all ages because it is many works at once.

And it is also a reflection on the journey human beings undertake to become better people.

Throughout the opera, the characters are confronted with two ways of understanding the world. On one side stand fear, revenge, deception and ignorance. On the other, wisdom, kindness, truth and trust.

That is why light and darkness appear throughout the work. They do not simply represent day and night, but two attitudes towards life.

The trials Tamino and Pamina must overcome are not merely external obstacles. They are also an inner journey that teaches them to grow, trust one another and discover who they truly are.

The Magic Flute and the enchanted bells symbolise the transformative power of music. Through it, fear is calmed, conflicts are resolved, and the characters find the strength to move forward.

Perhaps this is the opera's most enduring message: that kindness is not a weakness, but a form of courage.

And that light, however small, can always find its way through the darkness.

THE PRODUCTION

A Magic Flute of Light and Dreams

Òpera Popular de Barcelona's production of *The Magic Flute* is born from the desire to bring Mozart's masterpiece closer to contemporary audiences without sacrificing its depth or its mystery.

To achieve this, the production creates a distinctive stage world that combines music, visual theatre, dance, circus and the art of puppetry.

Rather than seeking a historical reconstruction, this interpretation draws upon the imagination and the evocative power of storytelling. Its characters inhabit a world where reality and dreams coexist, and where every scenic element contributes to creating a poetic and emotional experience.

Puppets, fantastical figures, circus elements and choreographed movement do not appear as mere decorative devices. They form part of the dramatic language of the production and give physical form to the symbols and magic that permeate Mozart's work.

This theatrical approach transforms *The Magic Flute* into an experience accessible to audiences of all ages, while preserving its ability to move, surprise and inspire reflection.

For, like all great tales, this opera continues to speak to us about life's essential questions: who we are, what helps us grow, and what path we must follow to become better human beings.



THE STAGE WORLD

Puppetry, Dance and Imagination

Since its very beginnings, *The Magic Flute* has been one of the most imaginative works in the entire operatic repertoire.

Fantastic animals, magical instruments, extraordinary creatures, impossible trials and characters who seem to have stepped out of a dream coexist in a story where anything is possible.

Òpera Popular de Barcelona embraces this spirit and places it at the heart of its staging.

Puppetry, dance, movement and visual imagery do not merely accompany the action: they are part of the storytelling itself, helping to create a poetic universe in which reality is constantly transformed.

As in all great fairy tales, what matters is not whether magic exists, but its ability to reveal a deeper human truth.

When Tamino gazes upon Pamina's portrait for the first time, Mozart seems to suspend time itself.

In just a few moments, the young prince moves from curiosity to complete enchantment.

Filled with light and tenderness, the music introduces love for the first time as the force that will guide the entire story.

Papageno enters singing, smiling and proudly boasting of his achievements as a bird-catcher.

Mozart reserves for him music of immediate and irresistible charm, capable of winning over the audience from the very first moment.

One of the most spectacular pages ever written for soprano. The Queen of the Night demands that Pamina kill Sarastro, transforming maternal love into an explosion of rage, power and despair.

Its breathtaking high notes have made this aria one of the most famous in the entire history of music.

A Girl or a Wife Ein Mädchen oder Weibchen

After all the adventures, Papageno is still searching for something far simpler than wisdom or glory: someone with whom to share his life.

Mozart portrays this desire through music filled with humour, warmth and humanity.

It is one of the most touching moments in the entire opera.

The Triumph of Light *Finale*

After overcoming the trials, Tamino and Pamina symbolically attain the light.

The music celebrates reconciliation, wisdom and kindness as forces capable of transforming the world.

Stage director, playwright and founder of Opera Popular de Barcelona. He began his directing career in 1982, the same year he received the Adrià Gual National Award for Best Directing Project for *La desaparició de Wendy* by Josep M. Benet i Jornet.

Throughout his career, he has directed theatrical and musical productions such as *Con Belisa by Federico García Lorca* — for which he was nominated as Best Guest Director by the Association of Entertainment Critics of New York (ACE) —, *El Llanto*, a finalist for the Max Awards, *La Vampira del Raval*, which received five Butaca Awards and a Max Award for Best Musical Composition, and *Romance de Curro el Palmo*, premiered at the Barcelona Grec Festival.

His work is characterised by the pursuit of a distinctive theatrical language that combines emotion, visual imagination and a close connection with popular culture. As founder and artistic leader of Opera Popular de Barcelona, he has spearheaded productions such as *La traviata*, *Carmen*, *Orfeo ed Euridice*, *L'elisir d'amore* and *The Magic Flute in Catalan*.

A graduate of the Escola Superior de Música de Catalunya (ESMUC), he has collaborated with numerous ensembles and musical projects spanning a wide range of styles, from classical music to contemporary and popular genres.

His work as an arranger is characterised by a deep sensitivity to the expressive possibilities of each instrumental ensemble and by a constant search for balance between musical fidelity and artistic personality.

For this production of *The Magic Flute*, he has created a new chamber ensemble adaptation designed to preserve the richness of Mozart's original score while fostering a closer connection between musicians, performers and audience.
